Calandra and I were in Ft. Myers last month to help with school #2 in the current series of judges schools. Ft. Myers is a great place to visit. It's much farther south than Port Orange and they are able to grow lots of varieties of bromeliads in the landscape that we find suffer in our cool winters. Here's an example that we saw growing in the landscape at the Edison House in Ft. Myers:



This is quite a large plant and, like many bromeliads doesn't have a common name. Instead you must refer to the totally forgettable name of *Aechmea cephaloides*. Great plant – good luck trying to grow one in the landscape in our area!
