Next Meeting November 17, 2014

Speaker: Terrie Bert, Research Scientist

Terrie Bert is a research scientist for the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. She is a member of both the Caloosahatchee Bromeliad Society and the Sarasota Bromeliad Society, is a director of the Bromeliad Society International (BSI) Board, and a BSI internationally accredited judge. She has published six articles in the Journal of the Bromeliad Society International and coauthored with Harry Luther, a website fact sheet for the genus Aechmea.

Terrie Bert informative lecture and power point presentation will touch upon genera of the bromeliad world which includes the letter "**P**" – part 2 of "The **O**utstanding & **O**stentatious and **P**articularly **P**icturesque." In this lecture, Terry does a thorough review of *Pitcairnia*, *Portea*, and *Puya* plants.

Review of Previous Terrie Bert Presentation:

When the lights dimmed, the crowd's uniform silence was followed by Bert's thorough review of *Pitcairnia*, *Portea*, and *Puya* plants. Enhanced by visual graphics received from the everfaithful Florida Bromeliad Registry photographs, as well as other sources, Bert's power point presentation danced with visuals accompanying her scientifically delivered presentation (Bert holds a Ph.D. in biology from Yale).

Interesting facts from the lecture include the following.

Pitcairnia. Eponomynously delivered in honor of Dr. William Pitcairn [1711-1791]. Has a whopping 336 species – second only to *Tillandsia*. Can grow like weeds. Many bloom in red and at Christmas, hence making them the poinsettia of the bromeliad world. Pollination is commonly handled by humming birds. Young foliage can be stiff, and then grow as maturation advances.

Rare versions have white and yellow flowers, and *Pitcairnia stevensonii* wowed the audience with a 30-foot inflorescence, And, the only known non-American (New World) bromeliad is *Pitcairnia feliciani*. *Portea*. Named after Marius Porte. Only has 9 species. Because of the latter fact, all nine were displayed on slides. Many are shy bloomers, thus making them less desirable. Loves inhabiting sand dunes, making them a natural lover of Florida's environment.

Puya. A high altitude bromeliad. Has 219 species. Is an elder of the bromeliodeae – what we see as *Portea*, *Aechmea*, *Canistrum*, *Nidularium*, or *Neoregelia* – many others as well. Like pine trees, many grow where other flora will not. Two subgroups: (a) "core *Puya*" of the Andes, and (b) Chilean *Puyas* of the dry desert. The plants vary from large to small, to soft to firm, from delicate to indelicate, and pretty to warlike ugly. One had a 10 meter spike which awed the audience.
