Quesnelia By Karen Andreas

Quesnelia is a great bromeliad for the Florida landscape. Its various sizes, variation in inflorescences, and stoloniferous growth add interest to a collection even when the bromeliad is not in bloom. There are approximately 16 species in this genus; *Quesnelia* is definitely a bromeliad that deserves a closer look.

This genus was named for M. Quesnel, the French consul to French Guyana who first introduced this bromeliad to Europe. It is found in the central coastal regions of Brazil where it grows up to the ocean, on rocks, in pastureland and in coastal mountains. Coastal *Quesnelias* tend to be medium to large in size with brilliant pink inflorescences. Species that grow epiphytically (as air plants) in coastal mountains tend to be small, tubular species that often resemble *Billbergias*. The inflorescence is short-lived – about two works. While *Quesnelia* grows best in bright lin



about two weeks. While *Quesnelia* grows best in bright light to full sun, it can tolerate lower light conditions.



Generally members of this genus have spiny leaves, although the severity of those spines varies. Use spines to identify *Q. testudo*: the true *testudo* will have spines on its lower scape leaves (see picture). If those spines are not present, it is not *testudo*. It may be *Q. quesneliana*.

Give the larger varieties such as *Q. testudo* plenty of room. They grow vigorously and you will have a clump in no time. The smaller *Quesnelia* does quite well mounted, growing in baskets, or planted at a base of a tree, which it will climb.


Q. humilis is a smaller member of this genus (8-10 inches high). Its bright red inflorescence holds flowers that Steens describes as "orange at the base, shading to bright red and then tipped with purple." It is a vigorous grower, growing stoloniferously (the new pup is on a stem-like growth – or stolon).

Q. imbricata, in habitat, is epiphytic (an "air plant"), saxicolous (grows on rocks) and terrestrial (grows in soil or on the ground). Its orange-red inflorescence stays in color for up to a month. When grown in full sun, its leaves turn a bronze color.



Q. liboniana grows on trees and rocks. Its flowers are dramatic - navy blue and orange-red.

Q. marmorata pups with short stolons, making it idea for mounting or cascading out of a pot. Its leaves are green with brown or deep maroon blotches. Padilla reports a fruity scent emanating from the center of the plant prior to it blooming.





terrestrial bromeliad in sand by the edge of the ocean but is also found on trees in open pastureland. Grow in bright filtered light for compact growth. Williams reports that it is one of those bromeliads that needs to throw a couple of pups before it will bloom, so do not remove the pups right away.

Q. 'Tim Plowman' is a popular cultivar of Q. marmorata. Its known for its tall, upright leaves that curl at the top. Do not overwater this Quesnelia and make sure it is not in wet or soggy soil – its curls will straighten!

2. Everyone who sells plants MUST:

- A. Be a member in good standing of BSCF as of April 1, 2005;
- B. Abide by these Sale Rules;
- C. Place <u>at least FIVE</u> entries in the judged show;
- D. Work in the Sales Booth during sale hours: <u>at least</u> 4 HOURS (50 or fewer sale plants) at least 8 HOURS (51 or more sale plants)

(You do not have to work the entire time yourself if you designate someone else to work for you.)

ANYONE FAILING TO FULFILL REQUIREMENTS <u>C and D</u> WILL FORFEIT AN ADDITIONAL 25% OF THEIR GROSS SALES

- 3. Only bromeliads may be sold by members. The bromeliads may be sold bare root, potted or mounted using decorative or non-decorative materials. Only the Society may sell books, mounting materials, pots & other items.
- 4. Table space is very limited and will be ASSIGNED based on the number of sellers. Any extra plants you bring should fit under your table. Use of floor space must be approved by the Sale Chairman and conform to Mall regulations. Please be courteous to others.

5. 25% of your gross sales will be deducted as a donation to BSCF.

Florida sales tax will be collected from the customers.

6. **Plants must be priced in EVEN DOLLARS.** The minimum price shall be \$1.00. Plants should be priced & labeled BEFORE they are brought to the sale.

7. Your BSCF Membership Number will be your seller ID number.

Sellers are strongly urged to affix a small self-adhesive PRICE sticker to a prominent place on a leaf. Experience has shown that plants sell faster when the price is easily seen.

9. Plants must be clean and in good condition, free from insects or disease. Potted plants should be well rooted, and pots should be clean. You may also sell mounted or bare root plants, but labels must be secure. Bare roots with soil attached may be bagged for neatness. (Bring some empty pots or trays for displaying bare root plants.) Questionable plants will be removed from the sale by the Sale Chairman. If your plants are not already Florida State Inspected, they must be in the Sales Booth by 9 a.m. Friday morning for official inspection by the Florida Department of Agriculture.

10. Members are encouraged to DONATE plants in good condition for the sale.

Label them as described above and simply write "BSCF" instead of an ID number.

11. Plants not picked up by the close of show on Sunday will be considered a donation to BSCF. Reasonable care will be taken, but the Bromeliad Society of Central Florida, Inc. cannot assume responsibility for any loss or damage to your plants.

Time to Pick Your Show Bromeliads!

It's not too early to get ready for the Mothers Day Show and Sale, May 6, 7 and 8!

It's time to go through your bromeliad collection and identify potential plants to enter into the show, as well as those you may want to sell. Look for strong, healthy plants with good form and good color.

After selecting a bromeliad, the first thing you need to do is remove the debris between the leaves. You can do this by picking out the leaves and other debris (by hand or with a pair of long tweezers). Use a steady stream of water with some pressure from your garden hose to wash out any debris that remains behind. Next, check the plant for signs of scale – black fly speck scale or white scales. Use Safer soap or Ivory liquid soap and water to kill the scale. You can do this either by spraying the soapy solution onto the leaves or by filling a tub and dunking the plant. White scales will flake off, however black scale has to be removed. You can rub it off with your fingernail, sometimes by lightly brushing with a toothbrush or by using a scale scrubber. A light infestation of scale can be treated using Q-tips and rubbing alcohol. A final thorough flush with water completes the basic cleaning.

We will have our annual workshop in April with more grooming and potting tips for show. Start now and increase your chance of making it to the head table!
