## This Month's Speaker

Tom Wolfe is the speaker for our April meeting. Tom will be discussing Aechmeas. Tom joined the Bromeliad Guild of Tampa Bay in 1965. Holding many positions including serving as President a number of times. Tom has always been instrumental in encouraging and working with the BGTB members to present annual shows, participating in community shows and sales to promote bromeliads, refurbishing bromeliad beds at Lowry Park Zoo, Eureka Springs Park, and Ybor City Museum State Park. Tom helps create displays at the Florida State Fair annually promoting bromeliads and club members pass out literature to thousands of attendees. Tom has represented the Bromeliad Guild of Tampa Bay for many years on the FCBS as well as serving as Chairman.

Tom has designed and installed many residential and commercial landscapes featuring bromeliads. He is in demand as a speaker throughout the United States presenting programs on bromeliads to garden clubs, botanical gardens, horticultural clubs and bromeliad societies. Tom was General Chairman of the successful World Bromeliad Conference "Bromeliad Safari", held at Saddle Book Golf & Tennis Resort and hosted by the Bromeliad Guild of Tampa Bay. Because of Tom's leadership, the Club was able to make financial contributions to the Florida Council of Bromeliad Societies, the Evil Weevil Fund, funding for local parks, improvements to the Guild's meeting & library facilities as well as secure the financial future of the club.

Tom became an accredited BSI Bromeliad Judge in 1982 and is now a Master Judge. He served on the BSI Board of Directors for 14 years serving as Director, Secretary, and 6 years as Vice President and 6 years as President. Tom is the first BSI President to serve two consecutive terms. Under Tom's leadership, the Board operated effectively and efficiently to serve its members. He has worked tirelessly through the years, providing leadership when needed and promoting bromeliads on the local, state, national and international levels.

Tom and his wife Carol live in Lutz and grow their bromeliads on their 2.5 acres of land and greenhouses. Their family includes two children and their mates and six grandchildren, three boys and three girls.

#### **Cork A Natural Renewable Product**

Cork has been used for mounting orchids and bromeliads for years. Tillandsia air plants grow best when attached to cork bark. The uneven surface is perfect for finding just the right spot to attach them to. They will quickly root and become permanent.

I just returned from ten days in Portugal and spent several days in Alentemol, walking in some old cork oak forests. Alentejo is in south central Portugal and is where the majority of the cork trees are farmed.

Most of the farms have been operated by the same owners for many generations. They tend to stay in the family, as it takes 43 years for the first viable crop of cork to be harvested.

Once the tree is planted, the first harvest is twenty-five years later. This first harvest is the "virgin cork", the same type that is used for mounting plants. The bark is thick, rough and uneven. The bark is then harvested every nine years. The second harvest is less rough, but not acceptable for cork stoppers. This harvest is ground up and used for other production such as flooring. It is not until the third harvest, (the tree is now 43 years old) that the cork quality is the type that can be used for making cork stoppers.
