John Boardman is a member of the Bromeliad Society of Central FL. He and Pam Marion have spoken to our society a couple of times and were scheduled to speak again in March 2020 but were canceled due to the Covid Virus.

John Boardman started collecting bromeliads in 1990 after winning several bromeliads on a public television auction. He joined the Bromeliad Society of Central FL that same year and became active in showing bromeliads. At the 2002 World Bromeliad Conference in Saint Petersburg, he won Best Neoregelia with a mounted multiple of Neoregelia 'Ronald'. Years later he became an accredited Bromeliad Society International Master Judge. John's favorite genus is Neoregelia for the amazing colors and patterns on the foliage. He grows bromeliads in Saint Cloud FL under a 35' x 30' greenhouse, also growing many different genera, but his favorite is growing variegated Neoregelias.



Small intensely colored open rosette w/the characteristic patterning of the chlorosticta parent in violet to purple tones - Highly unique and recognizable once viewed.



Origin?. Appears to be a cv. of carcharodon . Exhibited by J. Boardman at Mother's Day 2002 BSCF Show Note 20 May 2010. Harry Luther writes that this plant seems to be the same as N. carcharodon var. atroviolacea. Originally in Register as N. 'Rainbow' but name amended to differentiate from the other two 'Rainbow'. Carcharodon Group. Reg. Doc. 12/2002 Country of origin: **Brazil**

Definition of Illume: make lighter or brighter, to provide, cover, or fill with light.

Definition of foo fighter: any of various unidentified flying objects, as reported by Allied pilots during World War II.





Defination of Meterorid: a small body moving in the solar system that would become a meteor if it entered the earth's atmosphere.


Mature, open rosette to 50cm. diameter. In strong light, arching, broad, glossy, maroon leaves with some green / pink / dark purple spots and mottling. The central cup turns rosy pink at blooming. Reg. Doc. 6/2020. Country of origin: **Florida USA**



This looks like a wonderful place to sip Iced Tea on a hot afternoon.

















