Everything stays the same...Bring food, raffle items, Friendship table items, Show and Tell plants.



November Program and Speaker

Dr. Terrie Bert

It is unfortunate, but just last week our scheduled November speaker had to cancel. However, our own Dr. Terrie Bert has agreed to return with a new program as the replacement November speaker. As of this writing, the topic of her program is still not decided, but it will be different than her presentation she gave in February.

Dr. Terrie Bert is a long-standing member of the Sarasota Bromeliad Society (SBS) and the Caloosahatchee Bromeliad Society and has held multiple offices in the SBS. She also served



the Florida Council of Bromeliad Societies (FCBS) as a representative and officer for eight years. For the Bromeliad Society International, she has been a Florida Director and chaired several international committees. She currently is Librarian, Curator of the Wally Berg Award of Excellence, and an internationally accredited Master Judge.

She's given over 100 presentations on bromeliads to numerous U.S. and international bromeliad societies and other groups. She has authored articles for the BSI Journal and the FCBS newsletter. She cultivates approximately 2,000 different bromeliads in 24 genera. She's won multiple top awards in local bromeliad shows and BSI world conferences and is a volunteer for and contributor to the BSI Bromeliad Identification Center. Terrie has a Ph.D. in marine biology and is a research scientist for the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. She also makes quilts and SCUBA dives.

DRIVING INSTRUCTIONS TO THE CORDELL'S

If coming from Cape Coral or Fort Myers, Take US 80 (Palm Beach Blvd) East. Just past 175 Take a RIGHT on to Orange River Blvd. . Go 4.0 miles to Buckingham Road. Take a RIGHT; Go 0.7 miles and take your 3rd LEFT on to River Road. 14041 is 0.3 miles on your LEFT.

Coming from points SOUTH, take EXIT 141 off I75. Take a RIGHT on to Orange River Blvd as you exit I75. Follow the above instructions from there.

Selection of a Theme and Name for the CBS Show

Better late than never...the Theme and title of our December Show and Sale is "The Bromeliad Peddler". We hope to conjure up imagery of and old world peddler who travels from town to town with his cart or wagon, selling his wares... in our scenario, included among his products are bromeliads and related items. Attendees and Judges of our Show are in, I hope, for a pleasant experience as they enjoy the exhibits and festivities. Check out the newly designed poster on the front cover.

SHOW EXHIBITORS INFORMATION

Each vendor is required to enter at least 2 plants into the Show on Friday. To accommodate the vendors who will be busy on Friday, you may bring your entries in Thursday night when the showroom setup is completed. Please have your entry sheet and entry cards filled out so Classification can enter your plants in your absence Friday morning.

All Exhibitors can get their ENTRY FORMS, ENTRY CARDS and SHOW SCHEDULES at the November CBS Meeting.

The Show Schedule will have all the rules and information that you need to participate in the Show.

ENTRIES start at 8 AM Friday morning. We hope to be finished with Placement by 12 noon. if you need assistance there will be Show veterans to guide you through the process of filling out your forms and cards correctly.

Placement will place your horticultural entries on the tables for you. The Decorative Containers and the Artistic Arrangements may be placed or assembled on the tables by the exhibitor if you so desired. Once entries have been placed, they may not be handled by the exhibitor unless given permission by the Show Chairman.

Judges may have horticultural exhibits turned by the Clerks to see all sides during judging, so keep this in mind when potting your plants. The viewing of Artistic Arrangements and Decorative Containers is determined by the placement of the mandatory 3" x 5" card or the entry card. Judges are not allowed to judge the rear of these exhibits.

All plants are judged on their individual merit and will be given a ribbon. Plants are then competitively judged for Top or Best of Awards.

PLANT SALE RULES

- 1. Plant sales identification, necessary sales labels and allocation of table space will be assigned by Chairpersons, Brian Weber- brianweber1b@aol.com, 941-256-4405 (Cell) or Geri & Dave Prall- PalmTreeGardens@hotmail.com; (239) 542-2245
- 2. Sale hours will be Saturday, December 3rd, 2011 from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Sunday December 4th from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Sales will be permitted to Show Judges and members actively working the Show and Sale on Friday, December 2nd from 11:00 am to about ½ hour following judging.
- 3. Plants will be received Friday morning December 3rd, 2011 following the setup of the sales area. (Setup time to be announced at the CBS November meeting) Unsold plants must be removed Sunday, December 4th by 5:00 p.m. or become the property of CBS.
- 4. All plants must have TWO TAGS A white or near white tag which indicates plant's **name** (it <u>may have your ID</u> on it, but no price). The second tag should be a colored tag either obtained from the Sales Chairman or a colored one previously used at a CBS Sale. This tag will have the **sellers ID**, previously obtained from the Sales Chairman and the **price of the item**. These should be clearly written on the upper portion of only **ONE SIDE** of the colored tag. All plants and other sale items must be labeled in this manner before arrival at the sale.
- 5. To be eligible to sell plants, a CBS member must:
 - a. Be a member in good standing at least six months prior to sale.
 - b. Is required to attend a minimum of 2 meetings a year.
 - c. Follow all Caloosahatchee Bromeliad Society plant sale rules.
 - d. Help in the sales area and assist in clean up.
- 6. All plants must be priced in increments of one dollar (\$1.00).
- 7. Plants must be clean and free from disease, insects, etc.
- 8. Twenty five percent (25%) of members' sale proceeds will be retained by CBS. Sales tax will be the responsibility of CBS.
- 9. CBS will not be responsible for loss of plants or craft items, however, all reasonable precautions will be taken to insure their safety.
- 10. Bromeliad oriented items (art, note paper, carvings, needlework, food, crafts, etc.) may also be offered for sale, subject to the preceding rules. These items should be labeled the same as plants, following rule #4.

CBS Meeting Minutes September 18th, 2011

LOCATION: Covenant Presbyterian Church, Ft. Myers, FL. AT-TENDANCE: 46 members and guests, including new members: Fred and Maria Rump and the following guests: Delia Sherck, Irene Thommen, Pete and Maria Quasius and Sandra Drake. WORKSHOP: "Tour of CBS Members' Gardens-Bromeliads in the Landscape" featured a slideshow presentation by Cate Peterson of members' gardens. Highlights included: massed planting of same colors, layering of plant material, use of containers i.e. ceramics, fountains, palm stumps or trees and garden art. PROGRAM: "Into the Lost World" by Bruce Holst. Bruce is the editor of Selby Gardens' research journal, Selbyana. Bruce shared with us his most recent research trip to the Venezuelan Guayana. A major geologic site, the Roraima-tepui is a formidable sandstone structure shaped in tiers like a wedding cake. Bruce and his team were there to take a modern inventory with photographic records, map rare species, publish analysis and a nature guide. BREAK: A twenty-five minute break was enjoyed. Thank you to Mary McKenzie and volunteers for the refreshments. CALL TO OR-DER: President, Vicky Chirnside call the meeting to order at 3:40pm. MINUTES: Dr. Larry Giroux, motioned to accept the minutes from July and August as printed and Kay Janssen seconded the motion. NEW BUSINESS: The CBS Show will be held on December 2nd in the building behind Terry Park. The CBS Sale will be held on December 3rd and 4th at the Pavilion in the rear of Terry Park. The hours for the Sale will be from 9-5 on Saturday and 10-4 on Sunday. Dr. Larry announced that the following will chair the Show committees: Vicky Chirnside, Marsha Crawford, Dr. Larry Giroux and Betty Ann Prevatt. The membership agreed to accept The Bromeliad Peddler as the Show theme. DOOR PRIZE: Eleanor Kinzie and Betty Ann Prevatt donated Aechmea nudicaulis var. albo-marginata which was won by Ingrid Holland. SHOW AND TELL: Led by Dale Kammerlohr. CBS Meeting Minutes July 18th, 2011

Covenant Presbyterian Church, Fort Myers, FL. LOCATION: ATTENDANCE: 34 members; the following guests: Laurie Oldum, Christian Jalbert, Clayton Cornelison, Clayton Cornelison, II, Justin Breusch: new and Natasha member. Sandra Catherine Peterson presented WORKSHOP: a power point presentation entitled "Effect of Light on Bromeliads". While there are exceptions to every rule, in general: shade lovers tend to be variegated and have burgundy or wine red undersides; partial shade (am or pm sunlight) is preferred by most bromeliads; sun loving bromeliads tend to be more cold hardy. Examples of too little light were shown: green strappy/floppy leaves. Too much light produced short and thick leaves with yellowing and leaf scorch. Bruce McAlpin brought in Neo. "Fireball" and Neo. liliputiana to further illustrate the effect of light on bromeliads. PROGRAM: Craig Morell, chief horticulturist at Pinecrest Gardens, entertained us with: "Cultural Tips from a Socalled Expert"—practical advice running the gamut of bromeliad care. Craig is a proponent of inorganic mixes and recommends trying them. One product Craig has used for orchids is Sta-lite. This medium is heavy and doesn't break down. Turfbase "Ouick Dry" is used for propagating plants and comes in multiple grades (from coffee grounds to cat litter) it too doesn't break down. For fertilizing Craig recommends the six month Nutricote (Dynamite) mixed into the soil since it needs to be wet. Nutricote produces a 12 month fertilizer called Plantacote. Nutricote also produces an 18-7-38 fertilizer that isn't on the market but can be purchased directly from the company. Craig's fertilizing motto is to grow healthy plants with slowed down growth. Craig's parting words advised us to READ THE LABEL when it comes to using pesticides. Many dangerous and permanent health problems occur when pesticides are used carelessly. BREAK: A twenty minute break was enjoyed. Thank you to Mary McKenzie and volunteers for providing refreshments. CALL TO ORDER: Vice-President Marsha Crawford called the meeting to order at 2:55pm. Kay Janssen accepted the September minutes as MINUTES: submitted by Secretary MaryLynn Murphy and Carol Sweat seconded the motion. COMMITTEE REPORTS: The Treasurer's Report 2011 2nd Quarter for April, May and June 2011 was announced and made available for the membership. NEW BUSINESS: Eleanor Kinzie will chair the Nominations Committee; the election will be held at the Dr. Larry Giroux reminded us that the November meeting. Extravaganza is fast approaching on Nov. 4-6 in Daytona and requested donations for the Auction. The BSI website has further information.
