PROGRAM

Stephen Littlefield will be the speaker at the next meeting with a presentation titled *Bromeliad Images*. As an artist who paints and does print making (e.g., mezzotint, woodblock, linoleum), he has translated his love of bromeliads into subjects of his artwork. In his talk, he will illustrate how bromeliads “reveal themselves to our eyes in different light, as captured in his initial exposure to the fascinating plants that are a past and current visual focus”.

He and his wife Kathy Risley are long-time members of our society. Last year he was honored with our society’s Membership Service Award for his contributions to FWC and the bromeliad world through his artistic talents that have helped expand the bromeliad brand and increase awareness of these plants. Steve has won many awards for his bromeliad art in art competitions at bromeliad shows, including BSI World Bromeliad Conferences (WBCs) and Florida Council of Bromeliad Societies Bromeliad Extravaganzas. He designed our society’s logo (see the header above) and has designed posters for the WBCs. He also prints his bromeliad art on T-shirts, sweatshirts, tank tops and tote bags that he sells at bromeliad events.

For the last 27 years Steve has been a fixture at the Dunedin Fine Arts Center where he founded their printmaking program and was a teacher for 25 of those years. He has retired from teaching now but is still active at the arts center where he continues his craft and exhibits his art work at group shows and solo exhibitions.

Steve and Kathy will have some bromeliad-printed T-shirts, wine and beverage glasses and cutting boards with Steve’s bromeliad artwork on them for sale at the meeting.

LAST MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

LAST MONTH'S PROGRAM

Jay Thurrott presented a program on *Growing Bromeliads in Northern California-a Visit to Some Hobbyists' Gardens*. On a recent trip to California, Jay and his wife Calandra visited their daughter who is a member of the Bromeliad Society of San Francisco. She had arranged for them to visit a number of private home gardens for several members in the San Francisco society and other bromeliad growers a little further to the north. Among them were Wesley Schilling (who is a former member of our society and worked for Mulford Foster), Casper Curto and Darryl Ducharme, Herald Charns, and Chet Blackburn.

During his visit to their gardens, Jay saw a number of bromeliads that were larger and brighter than the same ones grown in Florida. He showed us pictures of the following bromeliads as examples of this difference.

Aechmea ampla
Aechmea andersonii
Aechmea caudata variegated
Aechmea 'Excelsior'
Aechmea recurvata (esp. Aztec Gold)
Neoregelia 'Ardie'
Deuterocohnia brevifolia

Dyckia 'Cherry Coke'
Neoregelia 'Guinea'
Puya mirabilis
Tillandsia confertifolia
Tillandsia tectorum
 foliage *Vrieseas*

The primary reasons for the differences are temperature and precipitation. In Florida, our summer season is hot and rainy and our winter is cool and dry. In California summers are hot and dry and winters are cool to cold and rainy. A third factor is land elevation which is fairly flat in Florida when compared to some of the elevations in mid- to northern parts of California.

Jay also saw some bromeliads such as *Tillandsia punctulata* and *Neoregelia cyanea* that can grow in Florida but with great difficulty. He also saw *Fascicularia tamot* and *Tillandsia somnians* which he says he has not seen in Florida.
