Bromeliad Spotlight: Aechmea fendleri



Aechmea fendleri is native to Venezuela, Trinidad and Tobago and inhabits the cloud forests at elevations of 900 to 4,500 feet. Its black edged green leaves can reach 32 inches long. It is a rosette-shaped plant which can grow up to 3 feet. It is a stunning plant for the landscape especially when it sends out its 1-foot high, pink cylindrical inflorescence with blue, purple, and red flowers.
