## Bromeliad People From Around the World, Penrith Goff

South East Michigan is a long way from the native habitat of many Bromeliads from tropical South America. The distance of miles and different weather conditions has not stopped the travel of Bromeliads to the northern states. Not only will you find Bromeliads being grown in Michigan, you may be surprised to learn that the Great Lake State has Bromeliad Society. Penrith Goff is the President of The South East Michigan Bromeliad Society. The talented Mr. Goff is also the Editor of his society's newsletter. interest in Bromeliads began when Penrith was a young boy and came across the occasional article in garden magazines.

The S. E. Michigan Bromeliad Society was founded in the mid-1970's. At that time most of the members lived in or near Detroit. At present, most of the forty society members are widely dispersed in the metro area. To compromise, the meetings are held in different locations each month. Some members will find the

meeting conveniently close to home. Other members will find the location too far away to travel. The S. E. Michigan Bromeliad Society holds its annual show and sale at the <u>Matthaei Botanical Gardens</u>.

Penrith and his wife Ingeborg have been married since 1962. They live in Northville, Michigan, which is 30 miles west of Detroit.

Mr. Goff grows in a 9'  $\times$  22' lean-to greenhouse. Weather is the first and foremost challenge. At the beginning of the growing season, the Michigan temperature can rise and then plummet, keeping Bromeliad growers on guard. All this is repeated at the end of the growing season, Mother Nature's reminder that winter is on the way.

During the winter season, it is not unusual for the sun to make an appearance only one or two days a week. After weeks of winter clouds, the sun came out and burned a *Neophytum* which Penrith had grown in full sun all summer long.


When asked what Mr. Goff enjoys about bromeliads his reply was, "I enjoy the endless range of plant form and architecture, the incredible color, and the drama of the blooming process, the fact that--being so temperature tolerant, and free of pests and diseases--they are very easy to take care of. I enjoy the fact that, regardless of season, there are always things in bloom, and that very many bromeliads are strikingly beautiful plants even when not in bloom. I am also constantly amazed at their dogged insistence on surviving."

Penrith's other hobbies include gardening, drawing, lecturing to garden clubs, volunteer work on the bromeliad collections at the Detroit conservatory and at Matthaei Botanical Gardens.

4814/<u>LForce6766@aol.com</u>. Confirm your BSCF Membership/ID number and the approximate times you will be working in the Sales Booth.

Sale Hours: Saturday, March 5 8:00 AM-5:00 PM (setup Friday by 7:00 PM) Sunday, March 6 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM

- 2. Everyone who sells plants MUST:
  - A. Be a member in good standing of BSCF as of March 1, 2005;
  - B. Abide by these Sale Rules;
  - C. Work in the Sales Booth during sale hours: At least 4 hours (50 or fewer sale plants)

    At least 8 hours (51 or more sale plants)

(You do not have to work the entire time yourself if you designate someone else to work in your place.)

## ANYONE FAILING TO SATISFY THE ABOVE WORK REQUIREMENT WILL FORFEIT AN ADDITIONAL 25% OF HIS OR HER GROSS SALES.

- 3. Only bromeliads may be sold by members. Only the Society may sell books, mounting materials, pots and other items.
- 4. Set up will be Friday afternoon, March 4 by 7:00 PM. You may be able to bring in plants before 7:45 AM Saturday morning. There is no limit to the number of plants you may bring, but please be courteous to others. SPACE IS LIMITED. You must furnish your own table, if desired. You should also plan to display part of your plants on the ground.
- 5. **25% of your gross sales will be deducted as a donation to BSCF.** Florida sales tax will be collected from the customers.
- 6. **Plants must be priced in EVEN DOLLARS.** The minimum price shall be \$1.00. Plants should be priced and labeled BEFORE they are brought to the sale.
- 7. Your BSCF Membership Number will be your seller ID number.
- 8. All plants must be CLEARLY marked with two labels:

  A. Label with PRICE and ID number on the SAME side of label;

  PRICE ID#
  - B. Label with correct plant name (stays with plant).

Sellers are strongly urged to affix a small, self-adhesive PRICE STICKER prominently on a leaf. Plants usually sell faster when the price is easily seen.

- 9. Plants must be clean and in good condition, free from insect and disease. Potted plants should be well rooted, and pots should be cleaned. You may also sell mounted or bare root plants, but labels must be secure. Bare roots with spoil attached should be bagged for neatness. (Bring some empty pots or boxes for displaying bare root plants.) Questionable plants will be removed from the sale by the Sale Chairman. Plants will be inspected by the State.
- 10. **Members are encouraged to DONATE plants in good condition for the sale.** Label them as described above and simply write "BSCF" instead of an ID number.
- 11. Plants not claimed by 5:00 PM on Sunday, March 6, will be considered a donation to BSCF. Reasonable care will be taken, but the Bromeliad Society of Central Florida cannot assume any responsibility for loss or damage to your plants.
