Leu Members shop early on Saturday, March 13 at 8:00 a.m. Please bring your valid membership card and photo ID. Guests of members will not be allowed in until 9:00 a.m., this is exclusive for Leu Gardens' Members. Not applicable to AHS or any Reciprocal Garden. Our annual Plant Sale is always popular with visitors, we've slightly reduced the number of vendors and spaced them out more to help provide a safe environment for everyone. Face coverings (must cover nose and mouth) and physical distancing are required to attend this **event**. Only children 2 years and younger will not be required to wear a face covering/mask. Oviedo Neighborhood Bromeliad Garden Tour

Sunday, March 21, 2021 Begins at 1:00 p.m.

Ample parking on the street. Please no parking on the grass of any property to avoid damage to any sprinkler systems. Please proceed to the active tour site if you arrive late as the property owners will also be joining the tour to the other properties. Please do not post publicly. Thank you.

This is a tour of four properties located within a half mile within the Fox Chase subdivision of unincorporated Oviedo off McCulloch and Dean Roads. Total tour time 2 hours.

First Property LAKE HOME (1:00 p.m., 30 minutes) Gwen & Chris, 2039 Kimberwicke Cir., Beautifully landscaped property with palms, oaks and cypress trees, bromeliads, and other tropical plants that are located in the front of the property around through the back yard

along the side property with broms nestled around in the pool area and then down steps and travel a pathway to clusters of bromeliads in the Cypress trees lake area. Three blocks to second property.

Second property. SEMI-CIRCULAR RAISED BROMELIAD GARDEN HOME (1:40 p.m. 15 minutes) Beth & Jerry, 2278 Kimberwicke Cir., A multi collection of various bromeliads in a raised plant bed located on the front of this corner lot under mature oak trees. There are also a few large bromeliads in the back yard area by the pool. Diagonally across the street to third property.

Third Property. FRONT WALK WAY OF SUN LOVING BROMS HOME (2:00 p.m., 20 minutes) Gladys & Rene, SBTPS Members. 2267 Kimberwicke Cir. Multi sun-loving broms along the front walkway with a splash of bromeliads in the front border and a garden pathway of broms along the back side yard. This property includes various Asian fruit and tropical trees and an herb garden and other exotic fruit plants including coffee trees. Adjacent home to fourth property.

Fourth Property. BROMELIAD BACK YARD ROCK GARDEN HOME. (2:25 p.m., 30 minutes) Cathy & Dave, SBTPS/BSCF Members. 2279 Kimberwicke Cir. Unassuming basic front yard shaded by oak trees. Bromeliads are all in the back and side yards with a small nursery of bromeliads. Completely relandscaped back yard with bromeliads and small plants and bushes. Come see the 50-inch Neoregelia Moby Dick, gigantic xAndrolaechmea 'Dean', black bamboo, and collection of Billbergias. Just started collecting tillandsias a year ago.

Tom Wolfe

Tom joined the Bromeliad Guild of Tampa Bay in 1965.

Holding many positions including serving as President a number of times. Tom has always been instrumental in encouraging and working with the BGTB members to present annual shows, participating in community shows and sales to promote bromeliads, refurbishing bromeliad beds at Lowry Park Zoo, Eureka Springs Park, and Ybor City Museum State Park. Tom helps create displays at the Florida State Fair annually promoting bromeliads and club members pass out literature to thousands of attendees. Tom has represented the Bromeliad Guild of Tampa Bay for many years on the FCBS as well as serving as Chairman.

Tom has designed and installed many residential and commercial landscapes featuring bromeliads. He is in demand as a speaker throughout the United States presenting programs on bromeliads to garden clubs, botanical gardens, horticultural clubs and bromeliad societies.

Tom was General Chairman of the successful World Bromeliad Conference "Bromeliad Safari", held at Saddlebook Golf & Tennis Resort and hosted by the Bromeliad Guild of Tampa Bay. Because of Tom's leadership, the Club was able to make financial contributions to the Florida Council of Bromeliad Societies, the Evil Weevil Fund, funding for local parks, improvements to the Guild's meeting & library facilities as well as secure the financial future of the club.

Tom became an accredited BSI Bromeliad Judge in I982 and is now a Master Judge. He served on the BSI Board of Directors for 14 years serving as Director, Secretary, and 6 years as Vice President and 6 years as President. Tom is the first BSI President to serve two consecutive terms. Under Tom's leadership, the Board operated effectively and efficiently to serve its members. He has worked tirelessly through the years, providing leadership when needed and promoting bromeliads on the local, state, national and international levels.

Tom and his wife Carol live in Lutz and grow their bromeliads on their 2.5 acres of land and greenhouses. Their family includes two children and their mates and six grandchildren, three boys and three girls.


