Incoming Presidents Message

Good morning, everyone.

I do not become President until January, but we need to start pulling things together before the holidays divert everyone's attention. So, here is the email I promised on

volunteer opportunities. My main goal is to take all the work that keeps BSCF operating and break it down into many smaller jobs that people can readily handle. Below is a list of tasks with a brief description. Some can be split some into smaller sub-tasks. In most instances, the person who takes on a job is going to need helpers, and they will also need back-up who can cover when the person cannot be available. Even if someone has already volunteered to handle a task, you can volunteer to help them with a part of it. The most important thing to keep in mind is that we are all involved because we enjoy learning about broms, and the opportunities to acquire them that BSCF makes possible. It is OK if you do not know what a task involves. You are the perfect person to handle it if you are willing to give it a try.

Meeting Layout Coordinator: Initially will be handled by President until a different

approach is figured out. Duties- coordinate with Leu Gardens regarding the set-up of tables, chairs, podium, audio-visual, etc. after obtaining input from (1) Vice President regarding program/speaker's requirements, (2) Hospitality Chair regarding refreshment arrangements & any 'special event' (like cake at October anniversary meeting), and (3) any other activity at monthly meeting affecting numbers of tables, room arrangement,

etc. (such as member plant sales, silent auctions, etc.). A layout must be provided to Leu Gardens in advance of each meeting, by fax or hand delivery, together with audio-visual & like requirements. Discuss with Leu staff as to any questions. Confirm proper set-up on day of meeting before 6 PM.

Meeting Hospitality Coordinator: Set-up refreshments table, drape tables (including door prize, raffles, Show & Tell, speaker, plant sales & other tables, if any); shop for table utensils, napkins, etc. as needed; arrange for drinks, ice, etc. at every meeting; arrange storage of 'stuff' between meetings. (Limited storage space in cabinet at Leu Gardens.) This job requires showing up before 6 PM (before the speaker and members arrive with plants) to get tables draped. John Ventura has volunteered to handle this job. I'm sure he could use some help.

Raffle Coordinator: Be at the Welcome Table to sell raffle tickets, make change, distribute door prize tickets. Occasionally shop for tickets, etc. as needed. Gather up materials at the end of meeting & store (in cabinet at Leu Gardens); get cash to Treasurer. VACANT... This is an easy task, but requires the person arrive by 6 PM, and spend a good part of the meeting at the table. We need one person to be responsible for it getting done, but several people can share 'table duty time' so everyone gets to enjoy the meeting. If we do not have some volunteers for this job, there will be no raffles or door prize tickets at the January meeting!!

Speaker Helper: At many meetings we have a speaker who brings plants to discuss and to sell. They have often driven for an hour or three through rush hour traffic and arrive at Leu Gardens (usually around 5:30 – 6:00 pm) needing to carry several trays & boxes of plants, set up their sales table, their presentation, etc. They may never have been to Leu Gardens before, and have no idea how our meetings go. It would be good to have someone present to greet them, hold doors open for them, help carry their stuff, help them figure out audio-visual connections and the like. A side benefit is getting first look at what they have brought to sell. **VACANT**

Meeting Breakdown Coordinator: We must be fully out of the meeting room by 9 PM. The Breakdown Coordinator has the task of making sure we are. This involves un-draping all tables, wiping things down, picking up any trash left by members, cleaning up any messes, seeing that all items not belonging to Leu Gardens are removed from the room. There is often just 10-15 minutes to get the room cleared. **Pam Marion** has volunteered to handle this task. She will definitely need help.

Librarian: This person is responsible for making BSCF's books available to members and seeing that they get returned. BSCF has an extensive collection stored in a cabinet in a side room at Leu Gardens. People do not take advantage of it nearly enough. When Pam served in this role, she would pull out a couple of books at each meeting that matched or related to the topic of the speaker. I would like to see someone do similar, and perhaps highlight a book or two each month. **VACANT.**

Newsletter Editor: Gather material, minutes, photos, articles, etc.; prepare newsletter; email newsletter to all members and designated recipients. **John Vecchitto** has volunteered to continue in this role. It would be great if a couple of people would take on the roles of being 'reporters', supplying John with photos, news blurbs and/or articles. I would like to have a knowledgeable volunteer be a **Newsletter Proofreader**, especially for botanical names and terms used in the newsletter. Since this is BSCF's official publication and gets sent to other societies, we should make sure we comply with the technical standards for what gets capitalized, what doesn't, what is put in quotes, etc. Many of us make technical errors. A set of knowledgeable eyes would be good to catch any little oversights before the newsletter goes out.

Membership Secretary: Many organizations have a Recording Secretary who deals with the minutes and official records, and a Membership Secretary who deals with keeping membership records, receiving new member applications and the like. The BSCF By-laws make the Secretary responsible for both roles. When Liesl Haas was recruited to be on the Nominating Committee's slate for the office of Secretary, she was assured that her only responsibility would be as a Recording Secretary. Since Marilyn Howser already has all the membership rolls on her computer, she has volunteered to perform the Membership Secretary role..... We have relied on Marilyn to do so much for so long. But, we can't have our energizer bunny with no job to do! ...We may end up considering a Bylaw amendment to formally create a Membership Secretary position.

PLANT SALES - Each year, BSCF participates in the Leu Gardens Spring Plant Sale (March 12-13, 2022), the Mead Gardens Fall Plant Sale (first weekend in November), and holds its own plant sale over Mother's Day weekend (May 7-9, 2022). We need to have someone chair our participation in each of these. I think it would be good to have different Chairs for each sale. It is particularly important that someone step up to Chair our participation in the Leu Gardens Spring Plant Sale. (I have a prior commitment and will not be around that week.) The job entails coordinating with the venue; identifying/recruiting members to sell; communicating with those selling about venue regulations/requirements; coordinating set-up and breakdown; arranging/recruiting/training people

to operate check-out; coordinating publicity; arranging for the calculation of monies due to participating members, coordinating with the Treasurer on the issuance checks and donation letters to participants (& returning their 'price sticks'); handling whatever pops up. Those regularly participating in the sales are familiar with what to do, but there has to be someone in charge or things can get confused. Imagine if nobody showed up who knew how to process credit cards!

Holiday Party Coordinator: The December meeting (or November) is a social meeting to celebrate the holidays and the coming new year. There is no program and no business conducted unless something cannot wait until the January meeting. There is a tradition of having a gift exchange and in recent years BSCF has purchased gift plants for attending members. BSCF has supplied a main course for a meal with members bringing a potluck assortment of side dishes and desserts. Coordinating all of this is a job in itself, especially with all the things people have to do during the holidays and year-end work responsibilities. David and Cathy Schubert have volunteered to be the 2022 Holiday Party Coordinators. It is more than a year away, but I'm sure they would like to know there are some folks who will volunteer to help them put on the event.It may follow the traditions of recent years, or be altogether different. That will be up to David & Cathy.

Field Trip Organizer: Pre-Covid, we would have one or two outings over the course of a year visiting bromeliad nurseries, having a casual social get-together to see a member's collection or garden, or whatever folks were interested in doing as a group. I expect that sometime during 2022 we will begin to be able to have such outings again. Do we have a volunteer to plan an outing or two? – **VACANT**

Webmaster: BSCF has 3 presences on the internet. We have our own website: www.bromeliadsorlando.com. We have a Facebook society page: https://www.facebook.com/BromeliadSocietyOfCentralFlorida/. And, we have a Facebook discussion group we sponsor: https://www.facebook.com/groups/263882333744906. Greg Kolojeski updates the website and has volunteered to continue in that role. A half dozen people have 'administrator' status on the Facebook pages for approving postings and the like. A couple are no longer very active, but everything functions acceptably. We have no immediate need, but if someone is interested in one of these roles, let me know. The time will come when you are needed.

That covers most of what needs to be done. I've probably overlooked something. If you are willing to take on one of these tasks or help with them, email me or talk to me at the meeting next week.


