From Dr. Henry Nehrling (1853 – 1929)

For brilliancy of color the plant world hardly produces anything equal to that of many species of Tillandsias. The beautiful <u>*T. xiphioides*</u> has showy white flowers which exhale a delicious perfume and *T. dianthoidea* (now <u>*T. aeranthos*</u>) has beautiful blue flowers. Both are natives of Uruguay and Argentina. In some of the parks of Buenos Aires all the branches of the huge Araucarias are decorated with these plants and when in flower at Christmas time convert these conifers into beautiful decorated Christmas trees.

MINUTES OF MEETING BROMELIAD SOCIETY OF CENTRAL FLORIDA November 22, 2004

The meeting was called to order by President Karen Andreas at 7:00 p.m. Karen reminded everyone to sign in, pay any outstanding dues, buy raffle tickets, bid on the silent auction and help themselves at the food table.

New member Gary Signs was introduced and welcomed. The following guests were also in attendance: Pam Flesher introduced Virginia Loy of the Broward Bromeliad Society, Steven Wager introduced his cousin Vince from New York, and Bob Johnson introduced his wife Catherine.

Bob Stevens led the Show and Tell portion of the meeting consisting of plants brought by Grant Groves.

Grant Groves presented the evening's program, which was a beautiful slide show of his trips to Hawaii in 1970 and 1990 highlighting the beautiful bromeliad gardens in that part of the world.

At 7:55 p.m. Karen Andreas announced a 10 minute break.

Minutes – There being no discussion, Pam Flesher moved that the minutes of the October meeting be approved; Helen Kwiat seconded; and the minutes of the October meeting were unanimously approved.

Treasurer's Report –Treasurer Betsy McCrory reported that at the end of October BSCF had a balance of \$427.97 in checking, \$12,478.6 in the Money Market account, and \$35 cash on hand, for a total of \$12,941.43.

Freeze Cloth – Betsy McCrory accepted orders during the meeting for freeze cloth. Members can pick up their order at the Christmas dinner.

Election of Officers for 2005 – Karen Andreas read the following slate of candidates:

There being no additional nominations from the floor, Leroy Weaver moved that the proposed officers be approved; Carolyn Schoenau seconded; and the slate of officers for 2005 was unanimously approved.

Memorials – Karen Andreas read portions of a letter from Bert Foster's widow thanking the Society for the donations to BSI and the Parkinson's disease Association made in Mr. Foster's memory.

Karen Andreas advised that BSCF member Jim Mahler died of cancer two weeks ago. The Society will make a donation to BSI and the American Cancer Society in Jim's memory. Karen pointed out that most of the plants on the raffle table at this meeting were from Jim's greenhouse.
