

Minutes for 17 November 2019

Call to order: 1:20 by President Cate Peterson **General meeting**:

- The new slate of officers was announced and unanimously elected for the 2020 calendar year. See front inside cover of Newsletter for names.
- Reminder that the holiday party is December 8th in Buckingham at Dale Kammerlohr's place.
- Vicki Chirnside updated the membership on what happened at the latest FCBS meeting, which focused largely on the 2020 BSI World Conference in Sarasota.
- Vicki also requested that at least six volunteers sign up to be clerks for the CBS December show, running from Friday the 13th through Sunday the 15th.

The Edison Garden Festival is this coming weekend. CBS will have an information table at the Festival.

- Betsy Burdette reminded folks to grab yard signs and flyers for the CBS show and sale in December. Betsy is working on press releases but recommends posting the show and sale flyers to e-mails, Facebook, other social media, and Craigslist.
- **Workshop**: Larry Giroux and Betty Ann Prevatt updated the membership about the showing and selling bromeliads at next month's CBSsponsored event. Folks wanting to sell plants must enter at least two plants in the show. The maximum number of show plants to compete for the sweepstakes is 20. Vicki Chirnside and Luli Westra are handling entries and registrations. A request was put out for volunteers to place the show plants. Plants will need to be entered in the show according to the latest taxonomic classifications. There is a show category for unnamed plants, as well as the display-only grouping (for plants that are not evaluated by the judges), and the novice category. Merit judging of individual plants is first, followed by competitive judging.

For sales, the blue tag should have a price and the vendor's ID (usually their CBS Meristem Jan-Feb 2020 10

initials) below that. Whole dollar amounts only for prices. The membership sales table is for individuals selling small numbers of plants. **Attendance**: 47 members and 4 guests present



Guests: Wanda Schmoyer, Joe Smith, Keith Steinberg, Nicki Dougherty **Program**: Although bromeliads aren't toxic, per se, Marc S. Frank, an Extension Botanist at the University of Florida herbarium, delivered a talk about understanding plant toxicity. He answered questions pertaining to we mean when we say a plant is poisonous, what factors influence how our bodies react when we are exposed to poisons, and how do gardeners avoid exposure to plant toxins? As for why plants produce poisonous compounds, Marc says plant toxins are a form of self-defense, they protect plants from microbial infections, they provide a barrier between injured and healthy tissues, they give a competitive advantage over nearby plants (allelopathy), and they are a by-product of routine metabolic processes. He also cautions that it is not the substance that is toxic but the amount of the toxin delivered/ administered/injested.

Door prizes: *Aechmea* 'America', grown and donated by Bill Sheffield, was won by Betty Ann Prevatt. According to the BSI cultivar register, 'America' is "a vegetative sport off *Aechmea* 'Blue Tango' which occurred in 2005 at Bullis Nursery, Princeton, Florida."
