
We have returned to the Garden Council Building on Virginia Ave. March 2022 Auction: Sunday, Mar 20th 2022 April Birthday Party: Sunday, Apr 24th 2022

The facility is north of the Edison Gardens parking lot and about 1/2 miles north of our previous meeting location— Covenant Presbyterian Church. Virginia Ave is approximately 3 miles north of the intersection of Colonial Blvd. and McGregor Blvd. and is the 2nd Street north of the Edison Gardens

Annual March Auction

Each March in lieu of a regular meeting the CBS hosts our annual Fund raising Auction. The money made benefits our Society and the Florida Council of Bromeliad Societies.

The Florida Council of Bromeliad Societies uses our donations for various programs including continuing research for the eradication of the Mexican Weevil, also known as the "Evil Weevil". For over 2 decades the CBS has been a major contributor to the fight against this weevil, which is decimating native bromeliads in habitat in our State and the bromeliads in our collections.

Each year we ask the membership to donate nice plants and plant related items to be auctioned. These can include bromeliads, orchids, other tropical plants, tools, art work and collectibles. The items are split between a "silence auction" and a regular auction. This makes it possible for our members to bring in desirable, less expensive items as well as the possibly higher ticket items. All donations are appreciated. There are always bargains to be had and we always have fun.

We do the auction in lieu of our March meeting, although because of Covid we have not been able to host the Auction during the pandemic. The Society business is kept to a minimum. The following is the schedule we will try to keep to leave at a decent time.

12Noon

The location will be the same as in previous years (the Garden Council Gardens), weather permitting and the procedure will be similar. We should arrive at the LCFMGC building to begin setup of tables and chairs outside about 12noon. Starting at 12PM we need bodies to help in a variety of areas- Setup, record keepers, runners, people to fill out donation tags, holding area keepers and people to show the items and pass out the winners' successful winning stubs.

<u>Membership Dues:</u> We resumed collecting membership dues in January, 2022. Attached to the e-mail message in which you received your Jan newsletter, was a membership form. Forms will be at upcoming meetings. Please complete for 2022 and confirm your email and mailing addresses and phone contact # . Return this to Betty Ann at the meeting. The rates are still the same. \$15/20 for single/ dual renewing members; \$20/25 for single/dual new members. Any new members that joined in Oct, Nov or Dec 2021 are paid up for 2022. New members, be sure to give Betty Ann the name(s) you want on your name tags; for other members, Betty Ann can probably reorder a lost name tag for a nominal fee.

12:30-1:45PM

We will be accepting donations such as bromeliads, other tropical plants, bromeliad and gardening related items, books and art. Bromeliads should be clean and healthy and appropriately labeled. If you are unsure about the name of a plant, ask other members for an ID. Certain items will be selected from donations for the SILENT AUCTION. The selection of Silent and Live auction items is at the discretion of the organizers, but if you wish an item specifically for the live auction, clip a note to the item to let us know. All items will be numbered and labeled and will be displayed until the Auction begins. Please register for your bidding number at this time. You can get your "bidding plate" at the recording table. <u>You can not bid in either Auction without a number.</u>

1:15 PM- 2:00 PM

Refreshment Break

This is the time for review of auction items and submission of initial bids for Silent Auction items, which will be set up on side tables. Each item will have a bidding sheet for you to write your bidding number and an offer. Bidders can <u>continuously</u> up the bid as they wish. Even during the live auction, feel free to check your bid and increase it. Bidding will continue until the Silent Auction items are <u>randomly selected</u> and sold to the bidder who has bid the highest. Please bear with us, we will still be receiving donations and labeling them until about 1:45PM, so things may look like a mad house! <u>At the present time we ask you to bring your own beverages and provide extra individually wrapped commercially prepared food items to share.</u>

2:00 PM

We take our seats and the Auction will begin following a brief business meeting and/or announcements from our President. During the Auction, Silent Auction items will be randomly removed and the winner will be announced. Until an item is taken, you may continue to raise your written offer. The auctioneer will with the assistance of those who brought the item or other commentators, describe the item and auction off the items to the highest bidder during the regular Auction. After an item has been won it will be returned to a holding area. You will be given a claim stub with the price you bid and the item's number, immediately after you have won an item. Depending on the size of the audience and the bulk of the item, items may be delivered directly and immediately to the winning bidder.

Conclusion of Auctions

At the completion of the auction you take your claim stubs to the cashiers and pay for your items with <u>cash or check</u>. After you have paid

for your items, the claim stubs can be shown to the workers in the holding area to claim your winnings...so hold on to them. Your items will be handed over to you. We ask that you help us avoid any confusion. We want everybody to get exactly what they have won as quickly as possible without mistakes. Please note that this year we will be using a two part ticket; one part stays with the plant and the winning bidder receives one part immediately after winning the item, which they will need to claim their winnings. This makes it possible for bidders to check out early since you will know exactly what you owe by adding up you stubs; however, we encourage members to stay until the completion of the Auction when we will have several people available to check you out.

Please come to the Auction and have some fun while supporting the CBS and the FCBS with donations and the purchase of items. As in past years, 1/2 of the proceeds after expenses will be donated to the Florida Council of Bromeliad Societies. We have been generous donors for at least the 30 years I have been a member. We are acknowledged by the FCBS as their number one Affiliate contributor to the Council's projects including the "Evil Weevil Eradication Program". We all can take much pride in this accomplishment.

Front Cover photo: Pitcairnias are terrestrial bromeliads also referred to as "Grass" bromeliads. They can be adapted to many growing conditions from shade to full sun and pot culture to in the ground. The majority of the species have upright multi-branched inflorescences with relative long red and orange flowers. They are extremely easy to care for, but should not be allowed to dry out. They like their food and in the ground will spread rapidly. In the pot their roots quickly become pot bound and should be divided and given more pot space regularly. In Hawaii, I've seen plots hundreds of square feet in size of one species growing on a hilltop in full sun. Pictured here is an old hybrid made by Jim Irvin over 20 years ago called Pitcairnia 'Pinot Noir', a cross of two species *P*, rubronigriflora and *P*, xanthocalyx. Photo by Dr. Larry Giroux Back Cover photos: For decades since *Metamasius callizone* was imported into Florida in a shipment of plants from Central America, this pest has been destroying Florida's native bromeliads, especially Tillandsia utriculata.. This was particularly troubling since this tillandsia reproduces only from seed, so if the plant is killed before it flowers, no addition plants are produced. The weevil has become less particular and has infested many other Genera of bromeliads. Growers, from Orlando to the Keys will see the adult weevil on their plants, but often the tell tale sign of loose central leaves, fallen leaves on the ground or a jelly like glop on your plant, will lead you to the larva already chewing on the meristem of your dyckia, cryptanthus, tillandsia or another favorite plant. Please donate to our Auction and go to www.FCBS.org to learn how to pre-treat your plants, at least in your shade house, against weevil infestation. Because of injury to the environment and helpful insects, I recommend only treating your closed growing areas with insecticides.



General Meeting:

- Julie presented the annual donations agreed upon by the Board of Directors for approval by the membership. Donations were approved. Donations include those to BSI \$300, Luther/Padilla Research Fund \$300, FOF \$100, Six Mile Cypress \$100 and the CS \$300.
- Julie asked for volunteers to fill several committee positions.
