Our Meetings have returned to the Ft. Myers– Lee County Garden Council Building 2166 Virginia Ave. Fort Myers.



CBS was well represented at the June 2022 Bromeliad Society International World Bromeliad Conference in Sarasota, Florida. Besides the good turnout of registered and day-attendees from our Society, we provided donations to the "Basket Raffles" created by Betty Ann Prevatt and Julie Stein; financial help to the conference; organization and instruction for the Judges School by members Betty Ann Prevatt and Vicky Chirnside, with attendance by several CBS member student judges; donations to the BSI and the Cryptanthus Society portions of the Rare Plant Auction with Dr Larry Giroux assisting in the auctioneering and many contributions of time and participation to the Bromeliad Show with major Chair positions filled by Betty Ann Prevatt and Terrie Bert; Clerk and Judge volunteers and a significant number of show exhibitors from our membership were involved.

Dr Larry Giroux will be revisiting with a Powerpoint Program some of the activities at the WBC with emphasis on the Bromeliad Show winners and entries by our own members. He encourages CBS WBC exhibitors to bring in plants they entered for us to see up close.

Hospitality Requests

I know that we are all very glad that our Hospitality Table and Food has returned at break-time for us to enjoy. We are very grateful to everyone who have been bringing in the great snacks and many thanks to Diane Cornelison for volunteering to be our Hospitality Chair. However, you might have noticed that Diane was a little overwhelmed at the last meeting with the abundance of food items...readying everything in a short time and then cleanup, especially the washing of the dishes.

Eligibility To Sell AT The 2022 CBS SALE

Betty Ann has confirmed with Edison/ Ford Winter Estates that they will host our 2022 Annual Bromeliad Sale on Saturday, December 3rd and Sunday, December 4th 2022. This year we will have only the Sale in the Banyan Tree area as we have had in the past. In a later issue of the Newsletter, I will publish the Rules for selling and greater details of the Sale.

Due to the Covid situation during the last two and a half years, we have been lenient about the sale rules and eligibility. Last year you had to be a member of CBS by July 1st to qualify to sell. If we follow this rule (this will be confirmed by the Sales Chair), new members who joined in June are eligible if they attend 2 meetings prior to the Sale in December. 2021 CBS members who are behind in your dues for 2022, please pay your dues ASAP to remain eligible to sell in December. Just because you receive the CBS Newsletter doesn't mean you are an "in good standing" member of the CBS. Check with Betty Ann Prevatt about your status.



Chip showed many slides of spectacular plants and told entertaining stories of how Skotak developed so many variations over the years. Even though he actually "throws away" 95% or more of what he grows, Skotak has registered over 500 hybrids he considered worthy. Chip has visited Skotak several times in Costa Rica and had several slides showing his labs and great expanses of plants under huge shade houses.

Florida Council Meeting Report by Vicky Chirnside.

A Dengue Fever outbreak, spread by mosquitos, has been reported in the Miami/Key West areas. The Council urges everyone to stop using Malathion and Merit in their gardens as they are highly toxic to bees. A Bromeliad Extravaganza is being planned for June 2023 on the west coast of Florida. Discussions are underway with the hope that in 2024, the next World Conference will be held on the east coast of FL between Miami and Ft. Lauderdale. The BSI keeps a huge seed bank and welcomes all donations, especially those from species plants. Seeds can also be purchased. Go to BSI.org for more information.

Program: Ray Lemieux of the Sarasota Bromeliad Society, brought many terrestrial bromeliads which were pot bound, and demonstrated how to cut them apart, trim the leaves, and make new individual plants, all without gloves! A few interesting tidbits:

*He uses a "light" mix for his Hectias, Dyckias and other terrestrials: 75% perlite, 25% soil. He also uses a fired clay product called Turface, which provides excellent drainage with sufficient water retention.

*Dyckias come from Brazil, and need more water than Hechtias, which originate mostly from Mexico.

*Many Dyckias are also cold hardy, especially if grown in the ground. If in pots, however, they will need protection from extended freezes. This he learned the hard way.

*After separating clumps into individual plants, wait a couple of days before planting, to "harden off" the base.

Jason Mellica, also a member of the Sarasota Bromeliad Society, came with Ray, and brought many beautiful plants to sell. He also donated to our Raffle table.

Announcement: Diane Cornelison reported that there will be an Arts Emporium held on Saturday, July 23, from 12:00 to 4:00 at 481 Marsh Avenue. We are invited to bring plants and yard art to sell. Door Prizes: Rick Batt donated 3 beautiful *Aechmea mexicana alba*-

Door Prizes: Rick Batt donated 3 beautiful *Aechmea mexicana alba-marginata* plants. He reported that they will all grow 2-3 feet across when mature.

Show & Tell: Jason Mellica helped showcase about 10 beautiful plants brought in by members.
