It was a dark and stormy morning as a brave band of 21 FWCBS members and guests arrived at Good Samaritan Church in Pinellas Park to board the bus. Pouring rain and puddles surrounded the bus but people were undaunted as they boarded for the adventure. Ashley Graham helped organize the trip which included a stop for lunch and a stop at Tropiflora Nursery in Sarasota, in addition to the always impressive Caloosahatchee sale

and show. Our driver Rick headed south toward Ft. Myers and faced the challenge of driving into the morning sun while still facing heavy rain plus the number of tourists who were not used to the driving challenge of sun and rain made for difficult and risky travel.

The sale featured more than a dozen vendors including Michael Kiehl, Michael's Bromeliads of South Florida, Dr. Terrie Burt, Tropiflora's extensive Tillandsia collection, and more. Additionally, the group got to see the judged show that happens once every two years, and it was good to see the quality of the plants and have many judges nearby for advice and counsel. FWCBS has four members currently attending the BSI judges school and on the path to become bromeliad judges.

The FWCBS party moved on to lunch at the nearby Farmer's Market Restaurant where the food was as delicious as the reasonable prices. Most saved room for one of the more than 20 pie selections that are baked daily at the restaurant.

The final stop was at Tropiflora Nursery where we were greeted by owners Linda and Dennis Cathcart, who are also long-time FWCBS members. Our group had the full run of the many acres of shade houses and we were given special prices and a10% discount just for stopping by. Linda and Dennis credit the experience and knowledge they learned early on at the FWCBS meetings as instrumental in starting their own nursery, which is now recognized as one of the world's leaders in the sale of bromeliads.

# IN THE GARDEN THIS MONTH

#### Light and Color

Pictures below show how color in a bromeliad can vary in response to the duration and intensity of the sunlight it receives. This *Androlepis* 'Leonard Skinnard' resides on the north end of a patio under a screen enclosure. In the warmer temperatures of late spring through late summer it receives strong sun, and the colors are muted as shown in the picture on the left. In the cooler seasons of late fall and winter when the sun dips to the south, it receives a softer light and takes on the more impressive colors shown in the pictures on the right.
