## Horticultural Tips

If you have collected driftwood in sea water for mounting bromeliads, there is no need to let the salt leach out before mounting the plants. Several bromeliad enthusiasts report they have found no plant damage using driftwood in that manner. If in doubt, leave the wood out in the rain and in an area in the yard that gets good irrigation coverage, and that will enhance leaching out salt present in the wood.

A dehydrated plant can be renewed by submerging it in a pail of sugar water for several hours or even overnight. Mix one cup sugar to a pail of water. Do not use a galvanized container for long periods because of possible harmful effects. The treatment also works with orchids and ferns.
